TBS's unprecedented 100-episode order of **Tyler Perry's House of Payne**, a comedy about **three generations of one family** forced to share living quarters, premieres June 6. The sitcom is the first crack at television for the cross-dressing powerhouse behind *Diary of a Mad Black Woman*, who serves as the show's writer, director, and producer.

Adrian Grenier is best known as suave heartthrob Vincent Chase in HBO's *Entourage*, but in **Shot in the Dark**, he reveals a more vulnerable side, chronicling his real-life search for the father who left him when he was a boy. Although it was made on a shoestring and often has a raw, film-school feel, the documentary is moving and ultimately uplifting (HBO, June 3). —R.B.
